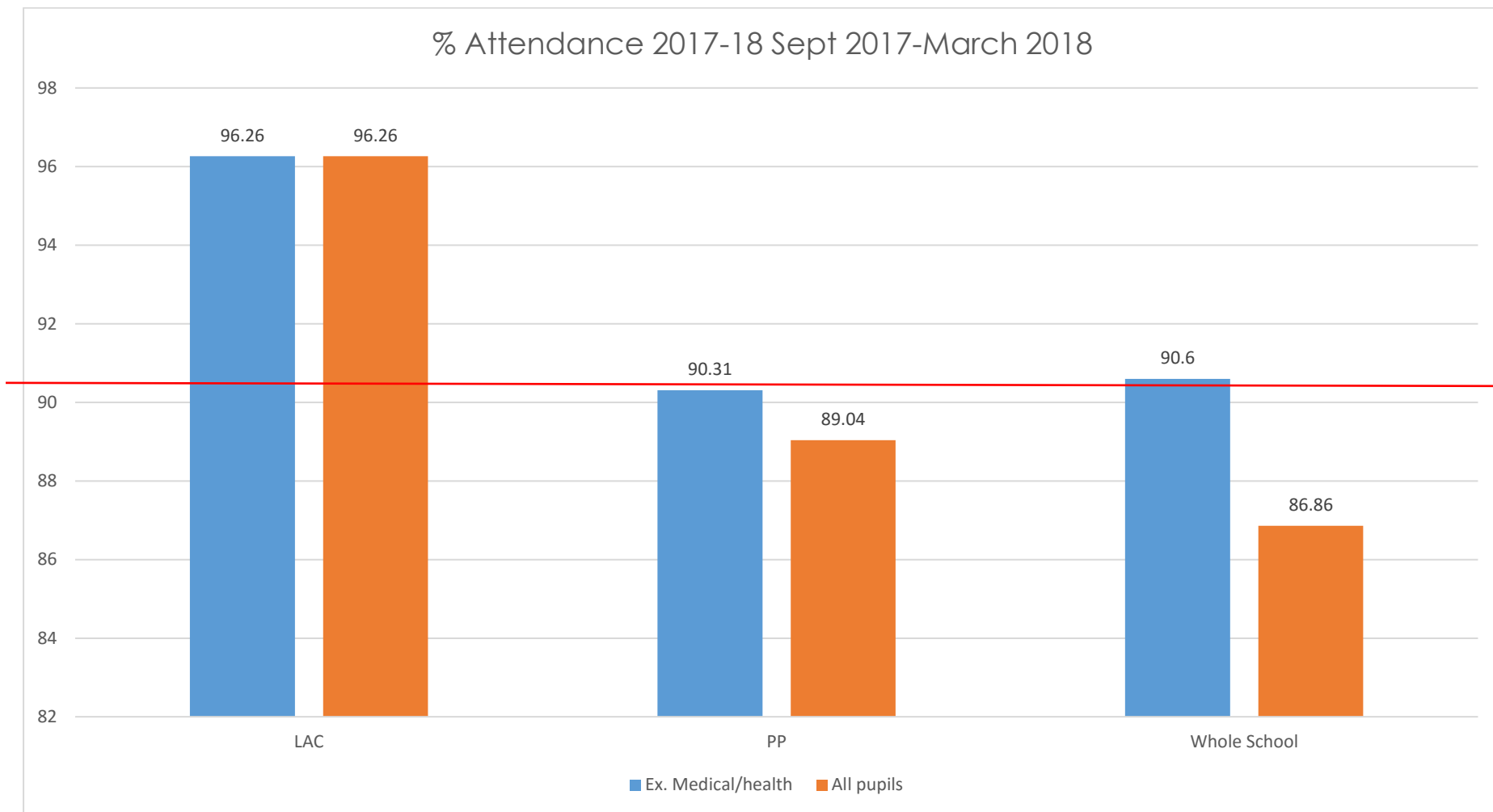

% Attendance 2017-18 Sept 2017-March 2018

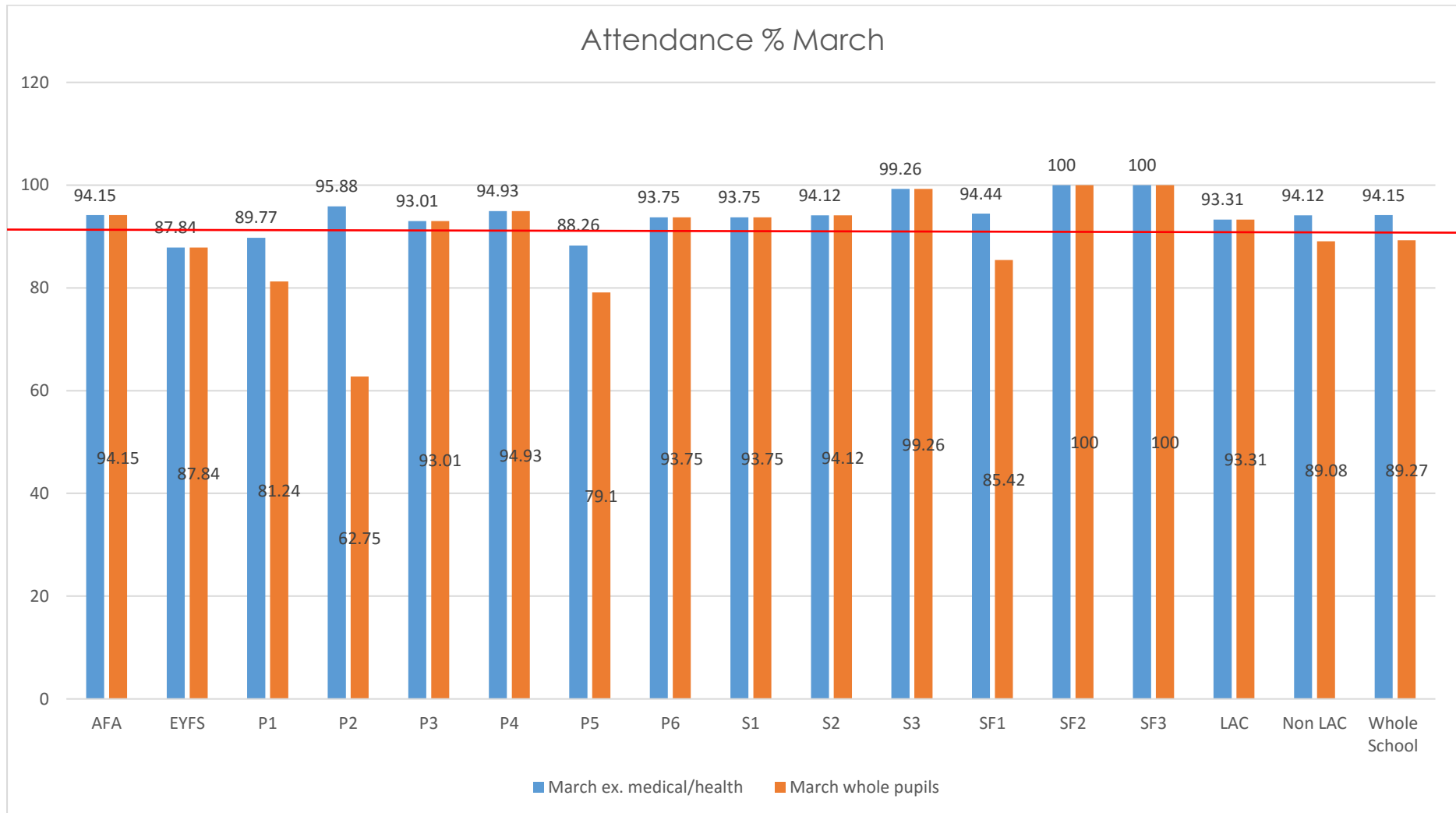


Outcomes:

The red line indicates the 2015-16 national DfE statistic data for attendance in Kirklees Special Schools (90.2%).

March attendance overall is good and is on track to meeting the expectations. It can be assumed that as the weather becomes warmer our expected attendance levels each month will increase.

Exclusion of health/medical related absence refers to those pupils who are off school for significant periods of time due to reasons relating to their condition. Medical appointments and general health absences are included.



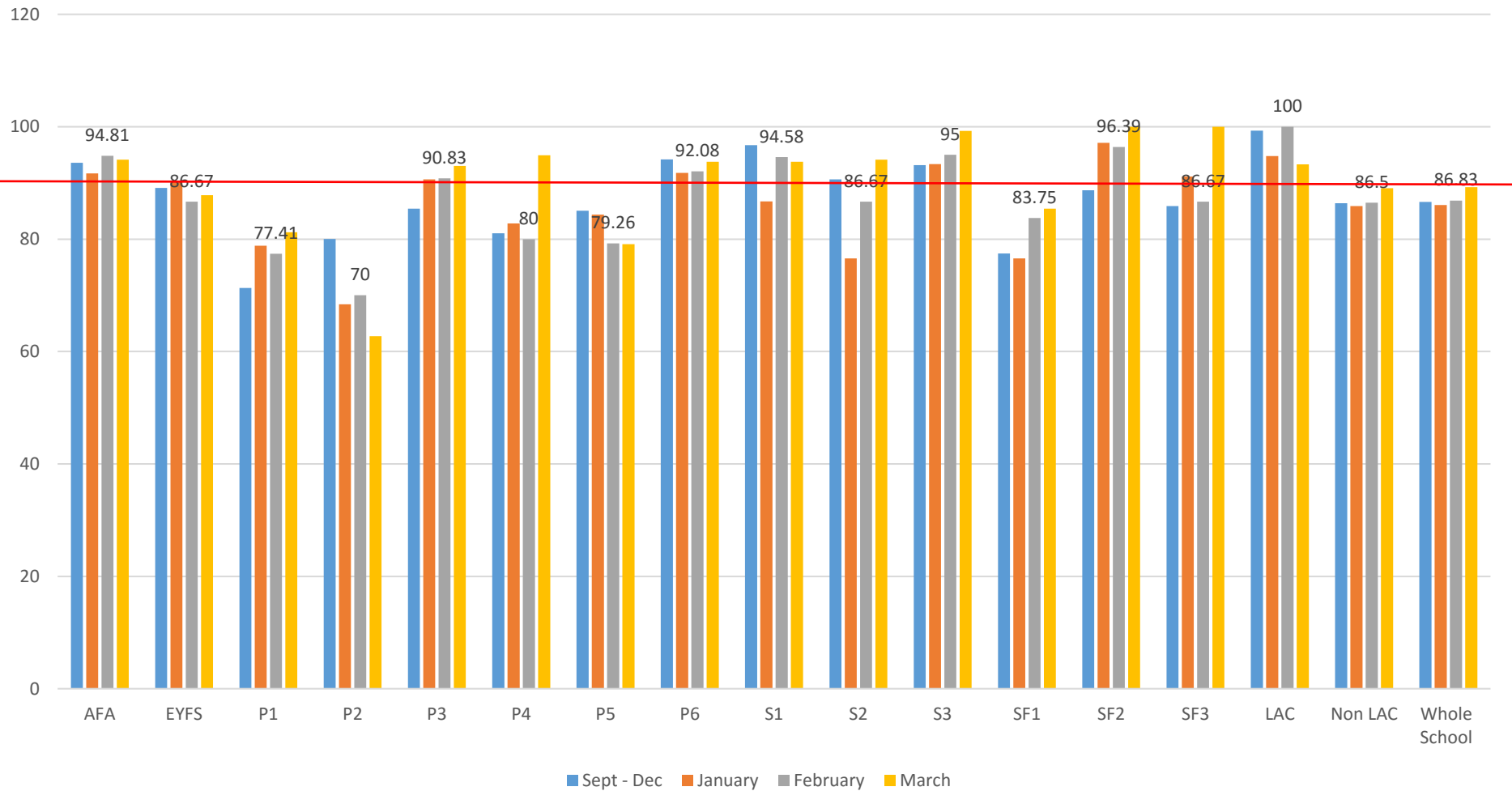
Outcomes:

The main areas of concern from the attendance data is Primary 5 and EYFS. These could be related to season variations and general illness. These classes will be closely monitored over the next month.

The EYFS data includes part time pupils of non compulsory school age. Next month the EYFS attendance will be split into reception and nursery.

Primary 1 is already being closely monitored and has a high number of pupils with complex needs.

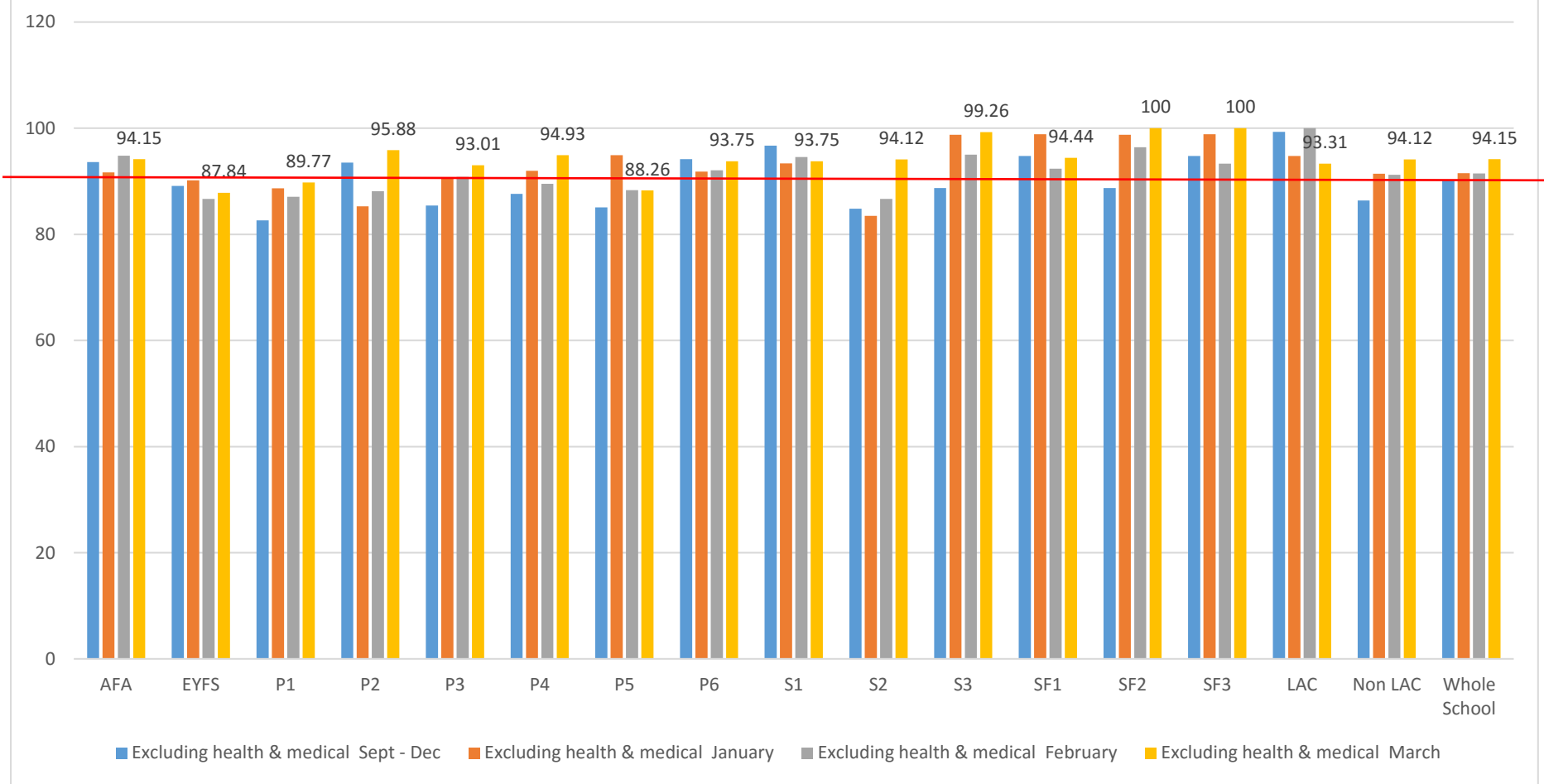
Attendance Monthly breakdown 2017-18 (all pupils)



Outcomes:

Overall there has been an increase in attendance for all classes from February to March. Although there are many contributing factors for this including changes in weather, it also an indicator that the supervision meetings and FLOSO input into monitoring absence is having a positive effect on the attendance %

Outcomes:

The outcome again shows that attendance is beginning to increase across all classes and in some instances reaching 100% attendance over the 4 week period.

The attendance will continued to be monitored every 4 weeks.
